Don't



- *Set the camera to high resolution, usually "Fine" or "high" jpeg (tiff not needed).
- *Take the time to pose the patient.
- *Take several pictures to allow options.

Avoid clutter and junk!

Use a backdrop.
(wall, door, carpet, towel)



Get your fingers and shoes out
of the picture!!

If needed
make sure
they are clean 😊

DO



Don't tower over the patient.

Get down on their level.

<< Notice the poor choice of background ☹



Avoid dark images.

Always use the flash
but stand several feet
away to avoid bright spots.
