Don't

*Set the camera to high resolution, usually
"Fine" or "high" jpeg (tiff not needed).

*Take the time to pose the patient.

*Take several pictures to allow options.

<u>DO</u>



Avoid clutter and junk!

Use a backdrop. (wall, door, carpet, towel)





Get your fingers and shoes out of the picture!!

If needed make sure they are clean ©





Don't tower over the patient.

Get down on their level.





Avoid dark images.

Always use the flash but stand several feet away to avoid bright spots.
